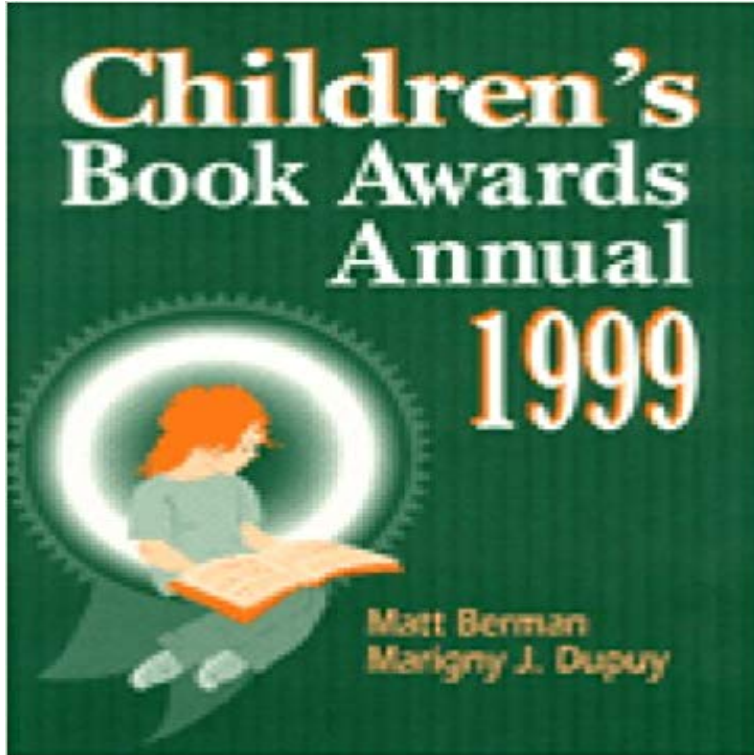


Childrens Book Awards Annual 1999
