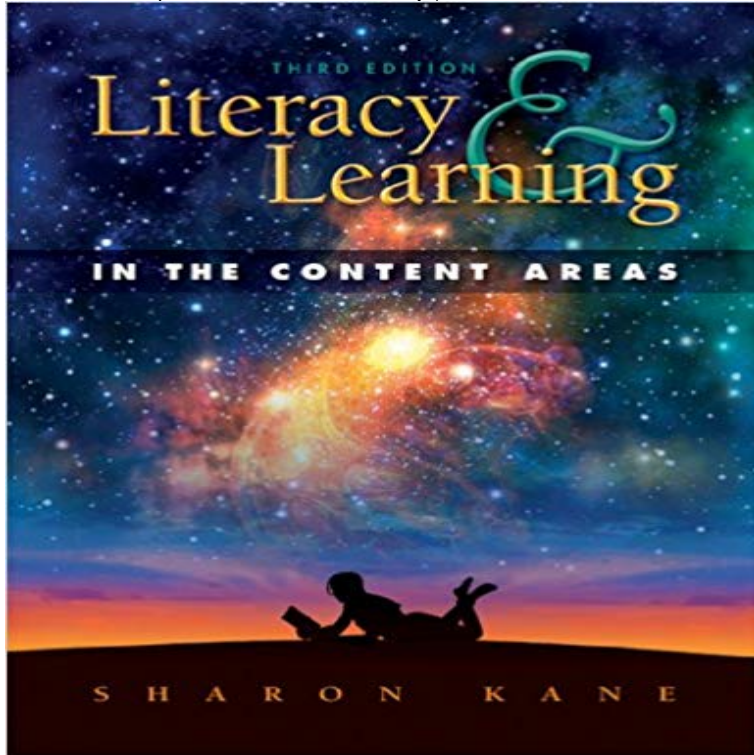


Literacy and Learning in the Content Areas
