

Dominant economic and political agents sought to develop the economy on the basis of its intermediary role, regional comparative advantage and competitive position in offshore service operations - all of which were viewed as essential to the viability of the small Lebanese state.Supporting an open and tertiary-oriented economy that serviced rapidly-growing Middle East economies, these forces shaped Lebanons economic order until 1958; and in a modified form, they influenced its political economy until 1975. Lebanons model of outward-orientation, however, can be usefully contrasted with the explorer-oriented industrialization model followed in East Asia.
